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# Council News

March/April 2018

#### Dear Readers

I trust you all had a happy and safe Easter. I took a trip down south to catch up with my family and take a break from the heat.

It was a very busy week leading up to the Easter break, starting off with road inspections with the Councillors. We left on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> March and travelled up to Mt Augustus which was to be our base for the next few days. We carried out the inspections of the roads in the Eastern side of our shire observing the damage caused by the recent rains. Over this time we inspected over 200 kilometres of shire gravel roads. With the council meeting scheduled for the Wednesday we held it at Mt Augustus Station. We had three meetings in total for the day, Audit Meeting, Biosecurity Meeting as well as the Ordinary Council Meeting. A big thanks to Don Hammarquist for providing the venue and to Cathy for the catering.



The shire's contract accountant Sue Voloczi has advised that she will not be renewing her contract with the shire as she plans to retire come end of June. The shire will now need to tender for a new accounting and financial contractor.

I have had a detailed discussion with our EH/BS regarding the establishment of a 'Public Pool' utilising the existing pool situated at the Tourist Precinct. I have provided a copy of Darkan's methodology and hope to replicate this to suit our requirements and gain approval from the Health Department. I am targeting having this sorted and operation for next summer.

I have been advised by WALGA that the City of Perth are once again running the 'Banners in the Terrace' competition, the school has indicated that they would like to design and construct a banner, accordingly I have registered them and they will go through the necessary stages?



# Council News

On the 20<sup>th</sup> March the shire took possession of a new 140M Caterpillar Grader. The old grader was purchased by Smith and Broughton whom transported it back to Perth.



The council has decided to donate the shire's old Steiger Tractor to the Carnarvon Speedway Club. The Steiger was purchased in 2013 for \$5000, and it has exceeded its projected operational life by a number of years.



The ANZAC Day Service will be held outside the Council Office, due to the new cenotaph not being ready for this year's ceremony. After the service the Junction Pub & Tourist Park will be putting on a BBQ lunch and meat raffles. I hope to see you all there.



29 March - 1 April 2018










#### PRINCIPAL'S POST

It has been very busy at the school since the last school newsletter:

- Two students have achieved 100% attendance up to week 8 of this term.

#### WA local rockmelon safe to eat

10 April 2018

Carnarvon rockmelons are safe to eat. The tasty, healthy WA fruit will under-go additional testing to ensure consumer safety after rockmelons grown in the Eastern States were tragically infected with Listeria.

Nationals WA Member for North West Central Vince Catania visited Carnarvon rockmelon growers to discuss the impact that the perception that WA produce is also tainted has had on this growing season.

Mr Catania said "Rockmelons grown here in Carnarvon are the best in Australia and are recognised nationally and internationally as a safe and delicious fruit that people can rely on for freshness every time they buy one."

"The public perception that all rockmelons are anything other than safe to eat couldn't be further from the truth."

"All of the affected rockmelons were from one grower in NSW and all of the remaining produce has been destroyed with none of the rockmelons produced there having come to WA."

A recent outbreak of Listeria in rockmelons from one grower in Nericon NSW has led to the widespread fear in consumers that all rockmelons are unsafe to eat.

Carnarvon rockmelon growers Anthony and Graham Kuzmicich said "We have been working closely with Coles and Woolworths to implement additional measures that guarantees our melons are fit for consumption and are of the highest quality and freshness."

"We need WA consumers to support WA growers," Mr Kuzmicich said.

Mr Catania said "West Australian consumers expect that the best fruits, vegetables and herbs are grown in Carnarvon and the Gascoyne region and they can shop with confidence knowing that that is still the case."

"These voluntarily safeguards put in place by Carnarvon growers ensure that consumers can continue to buy the best rockmelons in Australia with the full confidence that the only thing they can expect is delicious flavour and a full stomach."

## Midwest cancer patients will be at home with new hostel

The Midwest Cancer Hostel will provide rural communities with access to the health services they need, as close to home as possible, when it opens its doors later this year.

WA Country Health Service's Acting Regional Director Midwest, Karen Street, said the hostel was an important development for the region, which will enable people to live as part of their community while also receiving the support and treatment they require.

"A cancer journey can be long and arduous; more an uphill trek than an actual journey.



The new Midwest Cancer Hostel is under construction.

"Providing health services as close to home as possible is an important step in the health and wellbeing of our rural communities and the hostel is closely located behind the recently completed Midwest Cancer Centre to ensure patients are near to their treatment facilities.

"With seven double rooms, the accommodation is great news for not only the people receiving treatment, but their carers too," said Karen.

Careful consideration has gone into the design of the new hostel which will provide a welcoming, non-clinical, safe, secure and culturally appropriate facility for patients traveling to the Midwest for their cancer treatment.

"The brief was simple – to create a home away from home and I think we have achieved that."

Senior architect Nick Silich, SPH Architecture and Interiors, is pleased with the progress of the hostel, which will allow patients to be treated and cared for in modern, state-of-the-art facilities close to their families and loved ones.

"At the heart of the design is the focus on patient recovery and wellbeing," said Nick.

"Meandering paths, thoughtful landscaping and entry from the rear of the units through the outdoor areas all help to provide a layered transition between the public and private spaces."

Raked ceilings in all the rooms will also provide patients with a sense of openness and light.

The \$1.38 million Midwest Cancer Hostel is being constructed by the WA Country Health Service on behalf of the Australian Government's Health and Hospitals Fund (HHF).

It is expected to be completed mid-year and will be a welcome addition to those who need a 'home away from home.'


The Midwest Cancer Hostel is being delivered as part of a \$5.48 million commitment in Geraldton which has already seen the construction of a six chair, one bed chemotherapy unit completed in 2016.

Both projects are part of the Strengthening Cancer Services in Regional Western Australia initiative; a \$22.9 million commitment by the Australian Government which will see 10 projects delivered by WACHS across the State



# Easy Main Course Meals



# Spicy Meat Paella

## Ingredients

3 tomato ripe

1/2 tsp saffron threads

1 tsp salt

1 tsp black pepper fresh

8 lamb cutlets fat trimmed

1 tbs olive oil

200 g pork fillet cut into pieces

1 red capsicum cut into strips

250 g fresh beans topped

125 g chorizo sausage thinly sliced

1 tbs paprika

1 tsp chilli flakes

1 1/3 cup arborio rice

500 ml chicken stock (liquid) hot

1 tbs fresh rosemary

#### Method

STEP 1 Score a cross in the base of each tomato then cover with boiling water in a heatproof bowl.

STEP 2 Leave for 30 seconds then transfer to a bowl of cold water.

STEP 3 Peel the skin away and finely chop the flesh.

STEP 4 Grind or chop the saffron threads and place in a small bowl with a tablespoon of hot water.

STEP 5 Rub half the salt and pepper over the lamb cutlets.

STEP 6 Heat the oil in a large deep frying pan and brown both sides of the cutlets over medium heat.

STEP 7 Remove the cutlets and set aside.

STEP 8 Add the pork to the pan and brown.

STEP 9 Remove the pork and set aside.

STEP 10 Add the capsicum and beans to the pan and cook, stirring for 2-3 minutes.

STEP 11 Increase the heat to high and add the chorizo, paprika and chilli flakes.

STEP 12 Cook, stirring for 20 seconds or until aromatic.

STEP 13 Add the rice and stir to coat in the oil and spices.

STEP 14 Add the tomato and stir for one minute or until bubbling.

STEP 15 Return the pork to the pan with the juices and stir.

STEP 16 Pour in the saffron and liquid, the chicken stock and the remaining salt and pepper.

STEP 17 Arrange the lamb cutlets on top of the rice mixture and sprinkle with the rosemary.

STEP 18 Bring to the boil then reduce the heat and simmer gently.

STEP 19 Cook, covered for 20 minutes without stirring, ensuring that a gentle simmer is maintained.

STEP 20 Allow to rest for 5 minutes before serving.

# Dessert



# Dessert Lasagne

4 fresh lasagne sheets500 g cream cheese250 g dried apricots diced150 g dried cranberries

# Ingredients

1/4 cup honey

1/3 cup marsala

1 tbs vanilla essence

150 g Oreo biscuits crumbled

1 L vanilla custard

#### Method

STEP 1 Soften cream cheese at room temperature.

STEP 2 Combine softened cream cheese with apricots, cranberries, honey and marsala wine.

STEP 3 Refrigerate for approximately 1 hour.

STEP 4 Using an approximately 23 cm x 16 cm shallow baking dish, pour some of the custard into the bottom to cover the base, then layer the "lasagne" alternating between custard, crumbled cookies, cream cheese mixture and lasagne sheets.

STEP 5 Finish off with cream cheese mix and crumbled cookies on the top.

STEP 6 Bake in oven preheated to  $180^{\circ}$ C ( $160^{\circ}$ C fan-forced) for approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour, or until cooked through and lasagne sheets are all dente.

STEP 7 Serve as desired.


